Among the key highlights, partners explored the main outcomes of the Pathfinder Research, discussed the ongoing development of the Compass Web App, and advanced the Journey Blueprint & Chronicles, which are now nearing completion.

The meeting also allowed partners to refine dissemination strategies, improving outreach and engagement, while planning the upcoming Online Training and the real-life Camino experience.

A special moment of the meeting was the filming of team testimonials for the final documentary, capturing the voices and perspectives behind the project.

Beyond the working sessions, partners shared informal moments together, strengthening connections and reinforcing the collaborative spirit that drives InCaSa forward.

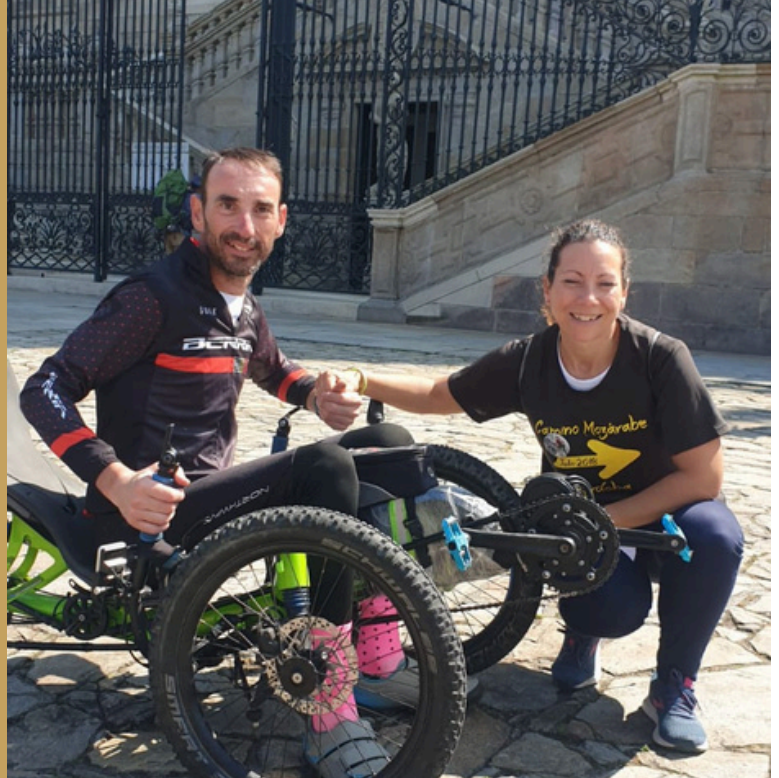
